Somewhere around May, 2012, it occurred to me that the website should take the form of a cafe, the site's pages mimicking menus for patrons wishing to either stand at the bar for a quick espresso (Au Zinc), or sit for half an hour (Salle) or to enjoy an afternoon at a sidewalk table (En Terasse).
